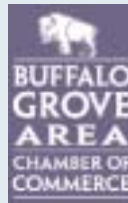

The IRS has announced that all of those frequent flyer miles you accumulate on business trips can now be used for personal use without tax liability. While the IRS noted that this rule may be subject to change in the future, the change would not be applied retroactively. Happy travels!

## Benefits Summary Plan Description Updates Needed

Starting in January, 2003, the summary plan descriptions (SPD) of your group health and retirement plan must be updated to adhere to U.S. Department of Labor Regulations. Compliance with the regulations, released at the end of 2000, will be time-consuming, expensive and sometimes confusing. Some of the rules are new; others are merely clarifications of existing requirements. Major benefit companies will write these SPDs but their minimum charge may be as much as \$500 per hour.

## New IRS Rules Simplify Small Business Accounting Practices

New IRS rules allow certain small service businesses (whose average annual gross receipts fall under \$10 million) to use the cash method of accounting for their income and expenses. It is expected that as many as 500,000 small companies will take advantage of this change. Previously, those businesses that purchase, produce or sell merchandise in an income-producing manner were required to use the more complicated accrual method of accounting. For those in the service delivery business, conformity with this regulation posed significant headaches in determining whether the sale of merchandise resulted in an 'income-producing factor'.

# Northern Illinois Business Political Action Committee

## Initial Legislative Survey Results

Over the past few months the Northern Illinois Business Political Action Committee has been surveying local State Representatives, Senators, and candidates for these and other statewide offices with respect to their positions on issues of interest to NIBPAC's member chambers. NIBPAC has identified and prioritized 14 issues based on input from each of the chambers. As reported in previous chamber newsletters, the issues represent concerns about transportation, taxation and cost containment, and work force attraction and development.

We have received the first group of responses to our survey. These and all future responses are being evaluated on the basis of how the candidate's response agrees with NIBPAC's positions on the 14 issues and priority rating of the issues. Listed below are the names of the candidates responding and their ranking given as a percent level of agreement with NIBPAC positions.

## ROAD CONSTRUCTION IN 2002



The Village of Buffalo Grove is interested in providing Buffalo Grove area residents and businesses information about the road construction that will occur in the 2002 construction season. Two major projects are being planned – 1) by Cook County, and 2) by the Illinois Department of Transportation. The Village will communicate updates of these projects to the public via a variety of means including Village Board meetings that are replayed on Channel 6, the Village’s web site at [www.vbg.org](http://www.vbg.org), and the marquee located at Lake Cook Road and Raupp Boulevard (municipal complex). Below is an overview of each project. Please be assured that although the Village is not overseeing the construction contracts, we will work to assure that the construction is conducted in the most efficient and effective manner.

**Lake Cook Road/Wisconsin Central Overpass** ~The Cook County Highway Department will be working on this project in 2002. The project involves the expansion of Lake Cook Road at the Wisconsin Central Overpass, west of Milwaukee Avenue and east of Weiland Road.

Preliminary work began the week of February 25th. This included the removal of a portion of the median east of Hastings Drive and west of Northgate Parkway. All drivers will be directed to the current eastbound lanes while work progresses on the westbound section. Lane closings will primarily occur during the work day and outside of rush hours. This work will continue until early April when the westbound lanes will be closed for what has been identified as “Phase I” work. Phase I will be the development of a third westbound lane and 18’ sidewalk/bikepath. It is the goal of the County to have this work completed by mid-late July so the westbound lanes can reopen in a four lane configuration – 3 traditional lanes and the sidewalk/bikepath lane. When the westbound lanes are reopened, Phase II will begin work on the eastbound lanes. Overall, the County believes that the entire project should be completed by mid-fall.

As previously indicated, the Village will work with the County on their project so updates can be provided to the public via the communication methods described above.

**Dundee Road Repaving** ~The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) is coordinating the Dundee Road project. Dundee Road from Rt. 53 in Arlington Heights to Waukegan Road in Northbrook will be repaved. The Village has been advised that the project is estimated to begin the week of March 4th and conclude at the end of the summer. In an effort to minimize the congestion that will result from the Lake Cook Road project, it is possible that Dundee Road from Buffalo Grove Road to Milwaukee Avenue may be addressed after the Lake Cook bridge deck reopens in July. The project through Buffalo Grove will involve surface grinding and milling to the curb in order to accept a new surface. Work will begin from the inside lanes and will only proceed to the outside lanes after the initial work is completed. We have been advised that access limitations (entrances/exits to business and residential areas) will not be allowed to occur for more than 15 consecutive days although this is being reviewed – there will always be at least one point of access to every location. IDOT will place construction signs along the road.

The Village will monitor these two construction projects very carefully. Although we are not overseeing the construction or contractors, we have advised the State and County organizations that their safe and efficient work is imperative.

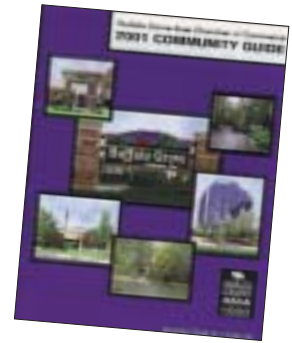
